Best Value Statement

The Governors are committed to achieving 'Best Value' in all aspects of school life and resources management.

We will use the four principles of best value as they apply to the establishment and continuous development of the school, and undertake to:

- Review and challenge the effectiveness with which the school enables its pupils to
 achieve their potential in all aspects of life and with which services are delivered, with
 reference to the school's vision statement, strategic plan and performance
 management objectives;
- Consult stakeholders as appropriate in making decisions and developing policies, promoting accountability to parents and the community. Parents will be particularly involved in this process, through parent governors and other means including the Friends of EHPS.
- Continuously monitor progress and compare performance both within the school and
 with other schools in similar situations. This will include reference to ASP performance
 data and the OFSTED inspection dashboards. The school will use an annual cycle to
 review the Strategic Plan.
- Promote *competition* in the procurement of goods and services in order to achieve efficiency and effectiveness in all we do.

We recognise that the way in which these principles are pursued will vary over time and undertake to review this statement annually, with reference to the school's budget and strategic plan.

In 2018/19, the principles of best value will be particularly relevant for:

- The management of the school building;
- The manner and timing of the school's response to numbers on roll, in terms of staffing and premises management;
- Monitoring and promoting pupil progress, including the use of pupil premium and sports' funding;
- Maintaining the school's profile in the community of Elvetham Heath;
- Continuing to provide a high quality education with efficient and effective use of resources in an environment with budget pressures.

The Governors will monitor all of these activities as part of the school's development, applying the best value principles appropriately in each case.
